PRIMARY RECAP

In yesterday's primary, several key races were being closely watched as indicators for trends leading into 2026. In Harrisburg, current Mayor *Wanda Williams* won the primary and looks to serve a second term as Mayor. In the Pittsburgh mayoral race, former State Representative and incumbent Mayor *Ed Gainey* lost his primary to challenger *Corey O'Connor*. In Philadelphia, District Attorney *Larry Krasner* is set to begin his third term since the Home Rule Charter was adopted in 1950 allowing for more than two terms, beating his competitor, *Patrick Dugan*. Current State Representatives seeking other office, included *Torren Ecker, Dan Miller*, and *Lou Schmitt*, who all won primaries for Court of Common Pleas in their respective counties and will have challengers in the General. Additionally, former State Senator *Larry Farnese* won his primary for Court of Common Pleas in Philadelphia. Other primary election results can be found here.

TOXIC TAURINE

A new study published by twelve researchers from the journal Nature points to a common

ingredient in energy drinks that may be linked to cancer. This potentially problematic substance is identified as Taurine, which is also a naturally occurring amino acid in the body. It can be found in foods such as fish and eggs, but it has also become a central ingredient in dietary supplements as it provides energy benefits. The harm, researchers argue, is that Taurine may inadvertently power cancerous cells and accelerate diseases.

RITE AID, WRONG MOVES

Drugstore chain Rite Aid will be closing 68 stores following the announcement of bankruptcy on May 9th. Forty-four of these stores are located in Pennsylvania, affecting PA residents across the state. Rite Aid plans to enter into agreements with other companies such as Giant Eagle, CVS, Kroger, and Walgreens to sell their assets from over 1,000 locations.
