The State House will convene at 11 AM for a non-voting session and the State Senate will convene at 4 PM.

BACK IN TOWN

The State Senate returns today for its first session day since the June 30th budget deadline. While the State House convened the last two weeks, the Senate kept its members home until a budget deal was closer to the finish line. Although the details of the deal remain uncertain, the Senate Appropriations committee is scheduled to consider HB 1330, a General Appropriations bill, to keep the process moving. However, additional days will still be required before the package lands on the Governor's desk.

PRIMARY COLORLESS

Four independent voters have asked Pennsylvania's Supreme Court to rule the state's closed primary system unconstitutional, arguing it denies them meaningful participation in elections often decided before November. Their lawsuit claims exclusion from primaries effectively strips them of voting rights in one-party districts. Named in the suit are the Commonwealth and PA Secretary of State *Al Schmidt*. While lawmakers debate opening primaries, the court's decision on whether to hear the case could reshape how 1.4 million unaffiliated Pennsylvanians cast their votes.

YORK IS BACK BABY!
