BROADCAST BUDGET BATTLE

Federal funding for public media has been cut by the federal government after the U.S. House and Senate passed a measure yesterday. Stations like WHYY and WESA might scrape by, but rural outlets, like WPSU, could face serious consequences, from losing educational shows to missing critical emergency alerts. An estimated 20 broadcasting stations in the Commonwealth will face cuts.

CLASS COSTS RISE

For the first time in seven years, Pennsylvania's state-run universities will raise tuition. PASSHE's board voted Thursday to approve a 3.6% hike, adding \$139 per semester to the base rate, now \$3,997. With the state budget still unresolved, trustees said they had no choice but to act before fall bills go out. However, they pledged to roll back or refund the increase if the Administration's proposed 6.5% funding boost is included in the final state budget.

NO STRIKES HERE

Just days before a planned strike, WellSpan Chambersburg Hospital and SEIU Healthcare PA reached a three-year contract agreement covering over 1,400 workers. The deal includes annual 3.5% wage increases, boosted differential pay, enhanced retirement and time off, and better tuition reimbursement. Union members ratified the contract after pushing for higher pay, stronger hiring efforts, and protection against outsourcing. Both sides called the agreement a key step in supporting staff and ensuring quality care in south central Pennsylvania.

Today through July 27th, folks can visit the York State Fair and enjoy a variety of shows, exhibits, and of course food! The interactive visitor center and gift shop stay open year-round, but the Skywalk and trail will close again after October for additional maintenance.
