AN EARFUL

The Pennsylvania Capitol drew a crowd yesterday as boxing legend *Mike Tyson* arrived to support recreational marijuana legalization. Tyson, now the owner of cannabis brand Tyson 2.0, met with lawmakers to advocate for regulated sales, saying the drug helped him rebuild his life. Not everyone was on board, though — an anti-cannabis campaign called "Truth on Weed" circled the Capitol with a digital billboard warning about addiction risks. Tyson said his experience proves cannabis can be a force for recovery, not ruin.

STANDING AGAINST HATE

Mechanicsburg churches held a "Hate Has No Home Here" gathering yesterday after a child received a K.K.K. recruitment card during the borough's Halloween parade earlier this month. The churches leading the event had worked with borough council, school administrators, and local police to keep the gathering safe amidst concerns of K.K.K. members being in attendance. Several of those churches and groups have decried the incident and have stated that any organization promoting racism, discrimination against others, or intimidation stands in direct opposition to the community.

Chunkosaurus Rex of Dinosaur Valley State Park has officially claimed the crown in Texas' first-ever Fat Squirrel Week, edging out **Chunk Norris** from Fort Richardson State Park in a playful showdown of fluff and fandom. The bracket contest, hosted by Texas Parks and Wildlife, featured 16 squirrels from across the state vying for glory based on charm, heft, and personality. Fans voted through Facebook likes and comments, crowning Chunkosaurus as the ultimate acorn-hoarder. Organizers say the event not only sparked laughs but also inspired more Texans to engage with their local parks and wildlife.
