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23ANDME SETTLEMENT

PA Attorney General **Dave Sunday** announced that Pennsylvania is joining a multistate \$18 million settlement against genetic testing company, 23andMe, over a data breach that exposed the personal information of nearly 200,000 Pennsylvania residents. The settlement resolves allegations that the company failed to properly protect customer data, specifically genetic data. The settlement will bring in nearly \$492,000 for Pennsylvania. A separate \$46.75 million class-action settlement is also available to all eligible consumers who were affected by the breach.

PARKS AND PROGRESS

Harrisburg is investing in park construction and housing development following the City Council's most recent voting meeting. A total of \$1.9 million will be reallocated from the city's parks and rec fund to fill funding gaps for projects at four Harrisburg parks. The board also voted to dedicate federal funds to nonprofit organizations that provide housing assistance and approved a plan to build twelve new apartments in Allison Hill. The decision came after the proposal had previously been tabled to allow the developer to address council members' concerns.

BOOKED IN YORK

A book festival kicking off in York tomorrow will be the first of its kind ever held in the county. The event will begin at 5 p.m. at Grace Manor B&B's Courtyard, where visitors can purchase books by local authors or pick up a free book from the festival's book table. The event's featured speaker, the city's new poet laureate **Heath James Hardin**, will be introduced by York Mayor **Sandie Walker**. Can't attend on Friday? The festival will continue Saturday at Ophelia's Making Agency from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

CAT RESCUE INVESTIGATION

Castaway Critters, the Harrisburg-based rescue organization that helped save several cats from a Glen Rock home, is calling for criminal charges after what volunteers described as one of the worst animal hoarding cases they have ever seen. Rescuers found cats and very young kittens among flea and maggot-infested debris, as well as multiple deceased animals. The organization says that it is

working with the York County SPCA and believes the person who held power of attorney of the woman who used to live in the home should be held accountable.

HOME RUN OF A TRIBUTE

Philadelphia Phillies slugger **Kyle Schwarber** honored fallen Central Berks Regional Police Officer **Kristen Yeager** at the Home Run Derby on Monday by wearing a memorial bracelet and inviting her children onto the field during the Derby. Schwarber has long supported police and fire families through his Schwarber's Neighborhood Heroes charity, and he reached out to Yeager's family, wanting to give the three young children an unforgettable experience while honoring the memory of their mother, who died in the line of duty in late May.
